Pray for our brothers and sisters there to have courage and hope through Christ alone during these uncertain days. Pray that they will be encouraged to put on God's armor and stand in His truth and love for them.

 3. Christians in Nigeria are under almost constant attack. Christian men, women and children are being killed or kidnapped. We need to pray for the endurance and strength of the Church in Nigeria to rest in God alone. Pray that their faith in Jesus will grow greatly through these hardships and trials as they rest in Him and find their refuge in Him.
 4. Pray for Christians who are imprisoned in Iran. Ask God to show them His love and blessing for them even in the middle of a trial, just like Job in the Bible. ▼
 5. Pray that Christians in Algeria will have places to meet to worship Jesus. The government has been shutting down many churches in the past few months leaving many believers without their place of worship. Pray that the Gospel will still be preached!
 6. Pray for a Christian man in Uganda named Ali who lost his two children, his mother and his stepfather in an attack after he placed his trust in Christ. Pray for Ali to know the comfort and hope of God through the promises of His Word as he grieves.
 7. Pray that Christians living in Papua New Guinea will be kept safe from the spread of violence and attacks there. Pray that the churches in Papua New Guinea will be united in the truth of God's Word and be a light for the Gospel to the lost around them.
